Stansted Airport Application Refused



Liberal Democrat-led Uttlesford District Council has refused Stansted Airport's application to expand beyond 25 million passengers per year, increasing the number of flights per year allowed from the existing runway.

"This is the right decision for the local community, and the right decision for the global environment," said **Liberal Democrat Councillor Alan Dean**. "BAA's proposed increase in flights and passengers would have an unacceptable impact on noise levels, air quality and the overall quality of life. The Airport has also failed to produce adequate proposals to improve the rail service and failed to show how they would deal with increased road traffic."

It is likely that BAA will appeal against the refusal, but the Council will mount a robust defence of the decision it has taken.

Liberal Democrat Councillor Vanessa Pedder added: "All the work that has been done over the last six months, and the evidence that has been gathered, will put us in a strong position at a public inquiry."

Post Office Opens



While the debate rages at Westminster about Labour's commitment (or otherwise) to rural post offices, Stansted's post office reopened in September thanks in particular to the efforts of Liberal Democrat councillors. The Post Office was about to pull the plug forever on the three-year closure when **Councillors Alan and Catherine Dean** reached agreement with the owner of the YZ Minimarket in Chapel Hill. Bins Boost Recycling

The government's Audit Commission has praised Lib Dem-led Uttlesford District Council for introducing the new three-bin recycling system and for taking difficult decisions and 'bold steps'.

They said that the previous recycling system inherited from the last Tory administration was not good enough, with too much household rubbish being sent to landfill.

Lib Dem Councillor Vanessa Pedder said: "The new system is already producing results, with a major reduction in the amount of refuse we send to landfill and a huge improvement in our recycling performance. I am delighted that local residents are using the scheme to help improve the local environment. It's been a great success thanks to them."

Tories Turn Lights Off

Policing Update



For many residents living in the centre of Stansted it was a summer that they will remember for the wrong reason. The Recreation Ground and the railway station acted as a magnet for anti-social behaviour by gangs of youths from outside Stansted. Clearly some of the youths were out of control and openly intimidated residents.

Stansted Liberal Democrat councillors were quick to respond to residents concerns. At the September meeting of Uttlesford District Council's South West Area Panel (chaired by Cllr Geoffrey Sell) Tom Boland and the Chairman of Essex Police Authority were present to listen to the issues. Cllrs Alan Dean and Geoffrey Sell have also met with Chief Inspector Graham Stubbs, Uttlesford Divisional Commander, in a successful attempt to improve communication.

Lib Dem-led Uttlesford District Council set up a multi-disciplinary meeting at the Youth Centre to consider anti-social behaviour. Cllr Geoffrey Sell attended the meeting along with representatives of Essex Police, British Transport Police, the Youth Service, the Mountfitchet School, Uttlesford District Council and Stansted Parish Council. There was a determination that the events of this summer should not be repeated next year. Lib Dem-led Stansted Parish Council is considering a drinking ban for the Recreation Ground.

Conservative-run Essex County Council is proposing to turn off many street lights in this area from 12.00 midnight until 5.00 AM.

"Local Lib Dems do not want the lights switched off where there is a threat to personal safety," said Lib Dem Cllr. Vanessa Pedder. "Street lighting reduces people's fear of crime, and prevents night time injury."

The proposal is supposedly aimed at cutting CO2 emissions, but guidelines from the Institute of Lighting Engineers show that a reduction in street lighting will not be good for the environment in the medium to long term.

A lack of lighting is likely to encourage greater car use as people will not want to walk around in the dark, causing more damage to the environment than the lighting.
