- Establish Chelmsford's second Park and Ride, probably at the A130/A131 junction, including a bus link to Broomfield Hospital.
- Downgrade the A130 between the Walthams and Dunmow.

### Campaigning for our NHS

### Campaigning for our Post Offices



Liberal Democrats have been calling for action to save more post offices from closure. They are proposing a policy that will provide the essential investment the post office network needs.

Local Liberal Democrats helped to get the post office in Broomfield Parade re-opened.

Lib Dem Malcolm Taylor says: "I am delighted that there is a post office there again. It provides a vital service for our community."

### Pushing for higher recycling

Liberal Democrats are calling for a separate weekly collection of kitchen waste, and other changes to raise Chelmsford's recycling performance.

More recycling means less waste going to landfill, which means less landfill tax, which means less pressure on your Council Tax.

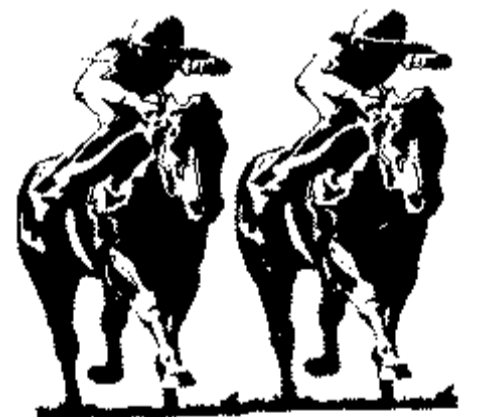
